

What is the Night Rating?

It is an optional privilege that may be attached to your Private Pilots License, allowing you to fly under Visual Flight Rules at night. It is a rating that doesn't expire.

Why would I need a Night Rating?

- Personal development - Flying at night is interesting and challenging.
- Safety - It is difficult to anticipate every eventuality during flight, but being caught out by sunset will no longer be an issue.
- Flexibility - There is no need to rush that second coffee or skip dessert after lunch in order to get home during daylight.

What is required for a Night Rating?

- A half-day of theory, dealing with the particulars of flying at night and revision of the instrument flying dealt with during the PPL.
- 5 Hours of flying, comprising:
 - A minimum of 1 Hour cross-country flying
 - General Handling
 - Circuits
 - Solo Circuits

What do I need to submit?

- CAA online form SRG1126
- Night Rating Course Completion Certificate
- Certified copy of your PPL license
- Certified copy of your logbook
- Copy of your medical certificate
- Application fee of £127
